WAR MEMORIAL



(SMR253)

The memorial is placed in the wall to the west of the pulpit and takes the form of a large rectangular brass plate let into a broad corniced oak frame. The lettering and decoration on the brass is inlaid in black. The border is a simple geometric Celtic interlace. At the top is an angelic figure holding a laurel wreath, and below

**TO THE GLORY OF GOD
AND IN LOVING MEMORY OF THE MEN
OF THIS PARISH AND CONGREGATION
WHO MADE THE SUPREME SACRIFICE.**

Beneath the names are the words in red – "*DULCE ET DECORUM EST PRO PATRIA MORI.*"
