WAR MEMORIAL

(SMR1605)

The war memorial erected to perpetuate the memory of those men of the congregation who fell in the Great War was unveiled and dedicated by the Rev. Dr. Ewing, M.C., Edinburgh, in September 1921.

The congregation stood when the names were being read and remained standing during the unveiling ceremony.

The memorial, erected in the vestibule immediately facing the main door, takes the form of a mural tablet in bronze, designed and executed by Messrs Tonks and Co., of Birmingham. At the top of the tablet are the years 1914 and 1918, whilst between the years is a laurel wreath. At the foot are the words "Greater love hath no man than this." The centre of the tablet contains the list of the fallen.
