Polmont Old Parish WAR MEMORIAL

Location: (NS 9357 7931)
Originally erected at the side of Polmont
Station Road immediately
opposite the bowling green. Although
officially called the Polmont War
Memorial it was often referred to as the
Brightons and Reddingmuirhead War
Memorial. It was dismantled in June 1968 to
make way for road widening and realignment. However it was not until
September of that year that work started reerecting it at Polmont North Church where it
now stands.

Description: It takes the form of a wayside shrine. The centrepiece stands some feet

above the surroundings and it is the shape of a beautiful hexagonal column constructed of Creetown silver grey granite. Six panels bear the names of the fallen and above these are canopies each containing an ornamental Surmounting, in letters of black, is the simple inscription bronze wreath. "This monument was erected in grateful memory of the men who made the supreme sacrifice in the Great War 1914-1919". Immediately below this the dates 1939-1945 have been added, with the line "We will remember them". At each of the four corners of the shrine was a pedestal surmounted by a lion rampant with shield. The pedestals were omitted from the reconstruction to enhance its appearance. The lions are of Lockerbie red stone, this serving the purity of the to emphasise granite monument which is represent the Trinity. Enclosing the shrine was a railing with a gate and a stair leading to the Monument. The railing was not re-used when the monument was transferred to its present location. The original land was gifted by Brigadier Kincaid Smith. Designer: Mr Robert Douglas of Messrs Robert Douglas and Sons, sculptors, Airdrie and Dumfries.

Unveiled by: Brigadier General K J Kincaid Smith on Sunday 8th October, 1922. Dedicated by Rev J Buchanan MacKenzie.
