"when Pioneer Adams was engaged in clearing out wounded under heavy shell fire. All the men in the company (the company then being at railhead) cleared out about 3pm and Poiner Adams returned alone. Presently the Captain of the Company came up, and then, with the captan and a number of RAMC men, they evacuated the wounded as far as possible, and then retired. The enemy occupied the place shortly afterwards. The whole of the work was carried out under heavy shell fire all the time.
